John Learned Bookstore Closing

With sadness, we are announcing the permanent closure of the Learned Bookstore in Fellowship Hall. When the church closed during the COVID-19 quarantine, the bookstore was not well maintained. Efforts were made to clean and organize the store, and progress was made; however a realistic evaluation concluded that there is insufficient volunteer capacity at this time to operate the bookstore. Rather than just allowing the bookstore to fall into further disorganization, the bookstore will be liquidated. For the remaining Sundays in May the bookstore will be open during coffee hour for people to come and take whatever books they wish. NO additional books will be accepted, but please take whatever you can carry! Whatever remains in June will be donated to a literacy charity. For those who might feel uncomfortable just taking books, free-will offerings for the Left Bank Books Foundation https://www.lbbfound.org/ will be collected. NOTE: the John Learned Library is not affected in any way by the closure of the bookstore.

First Unitarian Church of St. Louis Policy Board Meeting Summary May 13, 2024 Virtual

This month's Board meeting included two action items that required votes,

First, the Board unanimously approved the church's 2024-2025 budget as presented by Kathy Wire on behalf of the Finance Committee. The budget is balanced, requires no painful decisions, and includes a two percent increase for staff. Income totals \$417,000, \$415,000 in pledges from this year's Canvass (yes, we reached and exceeded our goal), and \$2,000 in prior year pledges that will be paid during 2024-2025.

Second, the Board passed a motion, again unanimously, to create a Sabbatical Minister Search Committee to find a sabbatical minister to serve during Rev. Kim's upcoming sabbatical from January to April 2024. The sabbatical minister will be part-time, focusing on Sunday services and pastoral care. The motion suggests that the search committee include representatives from Worship, Personnel, Care and Concerns, and possibly the Board.

Please join the Board for the Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 19, after church. Items of business include electing new Board members and officers and recognizing two members for their service to the church through the Ross Award, which recognizes a lifetime of service, and the Fathman Award to this year's most valuable player. We will also take several congregational votes, including one on our Active Hope Project and one on the proposed revision to Article II of the UUA bylaws.
