2023-2024 Annual Meeting Summary

May 19, 2024, in person and online via Zoom

Over sixty members gathered in the Sanctuary and online for this year's Annual Meeting on May 19, 2024. On behalf of the Policy Board, Chris Kocher presented Kathy Wire with the William W. Ross Award for institutional leadership and service to the church, our lifetime achievement award. Chris presented the Melanie and Anthony Fathman Award to Tom Finan for Tom's significant contribution to the church this year, recognizing Tom as this year's Most Valuable Player.

One of the highlights of the meeting was a congregational vote selecting Tabernacle Community Development Organization as our congregational social justice partner. The vote moves our year-and-a-half-long Active Hope Project forward into the implementation stage.

In a straw poll, a large majority also favored the proposed amendment to Article II of the UUA Bylaws, Purposes and Principles. This proposed change will be voted on during the UUA General Assembly in June. Our congregational vote is a nonbinding guide for First U's voting delegates to GA, who will hear more during the floor discussion.

We also elected new Policy Board and Church Council members for 2024-2025. We welcome our new President, Chuck Eby.

2024-25 Year Designated Collection Nominations Now Accepted

Nominations are reviewed by the Social Responsibility Committee (SRC) with consideration given to the fit between the nominee and First Church's mission and values, as well as the nonprofit's core focus, impact, and connection to our First Church community.
