Message from Board President Chuck Eby about Upcoming Sabbatical for Rev. Mason

This past August marked the beginning of the sixth year of Reverend Kim Mason's called ministry to First Unitarian Church in St. Louis. The UUA guidelines recommend congregations bank one sabbatical month for each year of service and ministers start a sabbatical no earlier than during the fourth year of a called ministry and no later than during the seventh year. In January of this year, the Policy Board approved Reverend Kim Mason's request to take a four-month sabbatical beginning January 1, 2025, ending April 30, 2025.

This is an exciting opportunity for Reverend Mason to enrich her professional ministry. A sabbatical committee, chaired by past-Board President Steve Wilke, will be assisting our sabbatical minister, Reverend Sabrina Trupia, and communicating with the congregation. There will be opportunities to learn more about ongoing Church activities during Reverend Mason's sabbatical and to provide feedback.

During the sabbatical, the Policy Board will continue to engage the congregation in the process of reflecting on and reshaping our Vision for First Unitarian which Reverend Mason started in late September.

We will all look forward to Reverend Mason's return from her sabbatical, and to the energy and new ideas she will share with us as we continue to live our mission and vision as a community of faith. Sincerely,

Inspired by a UU The Vote challenge, the Toward Justice Committee set a goal to send 200 Get Out the Vote postcards per member. The League of Women Voters sent us names and addresses of people in two nearby wards who are registered but irregular voters. Our congregation and some friends wrote and decorated a postcard for every one of the 2,413 names in Ward 14, using the best research available for what makes an effective postcard.

While we didn't make our goal of 200 postcards per church member, we are pleased and grateful for the response. Several members have commented on the community building effect this effort had on our congregation. People felt like they were engaged in a worthy effort and, being Unitarians, were pleased to be involved in a research project. We should receive the information on any change in voting participation among the people to whom we sent postcards by the end of the year. Thanks again for your effort.

Tabernacle CDC Update

On Oct. 7 Tabernacle Community Development Corporation(TCDC) celebrated 10 years of redeveloping the Jeff-Vander-Lou neighborhood at their Evening of Hope. Partners, including members of First Unitarian, celebrated newly built and rehabilitated homes with music, appetizers, and lots of positive energy.

We were able to tour both new and restored homes, both of which were beautiful, and built with quality construction, including 95% energy efficient appliances, double pane windows, custom cabinetry and noise insulation. TCDC sells the homes at $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of construction, and \sim \$40,000 less than appraised value, so owners start out with that much in equity. In addition, they have created over 150 construction

jobs for those in the community, and recruited neighborhood youth to work on rehabbing the homes, providing productive activity and skill development.

TCDC members and partners shared stories of lives changed by the opportunity to own and live in an affordable home built with integrity by members of the community. Pastor Andre Alexander shared his enthusiasm for the families in the neighborhood and his experience of the consequences of the project. In rebuilding the neighborhood, businesses have partnered at the CDC space entitled The Hub. The Hub provides a community center with services that include medical, legal, photo ID, banking, pathways to progress, and free speech pathology for preschoolers.

Following the home tours, the evening program focused on reflections with some of the original partners of the corporation. Highlights of the reflections included completion of the first home and filling all the space in The Hub with organizations that want to be part of the re-emerging neighborhood. It was an inspiring evening, and we are grateful that First Unitarian is part of this work in our
