First Unitarian Church of St. Louis Policy Board Meeting Summary April 14, 2024 Virtual

The Board adopted a policy to guide the Church minister, staff, leaders, and greeters in the event that an ICE agent seeks to enter the First U Church building. The Trump Administration recently rescinded a long-standing guidance policy that required Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents to refrain from immigration enforcement actions in certain sensitive areas, including those in and around

places of worship. The new policy clarifies our long-standing practice regarding which parts of our church building are public and which are private. It states that the policy of First Unitarian Church is to require a search warrant for entering or searching a private area of the building. It also specifies the actions that volunteers and staff should take if an ICE agent or other law enforcement officer enters or requests entry to the church building.

You can read a copy of the ICE policy here. President Chuck Eby will be available after service on April 27 to answer questions about the new policy.

The Board has also progressed with the Vision Statement process. Here's the proposed vision we will present to the congregation for a vote at the Congregational meeting on May 18:

First Unitarian Church of St. Louis envisions a vital, spiritual congregation fostering an active and relevant presence in the community.

This was the top vote-getter in a Survey Monkey straw poll, receiving a majority of the first-place votes. Please join us at the Congregational Meeting to learn more about the process and the proposed Vision Statement.
